


Infants

Love for Reading

As a school, we work hard to develop a child's love for reading. This will support them to read a wide range of genres and text types, which is reflect our English and class texts. We also want to support the children with reading at home to develop their confidence and fluency. You, as parents/carers, can support the children with this. The expectations we set are:

Years 3-6 (KS2)

We encourage the children to read at least 5 times a week—every day if possible. We stipulate that children read at least 3 times a week. Children can then record in their planner when they have read. Children who do not read 3 times a week, and





show this recorded in their planner, will be given the opportunity to read at break or lunchtime. Children who read 5 times a week will receive a raffle ticket. At the end of each half term, a raffle ticket will be drawn for each class and the winning child will receive a prize.

Reception - Y2 (EYFS/KS1)

We encourage the children to read 5 times a week - every day if possible. We stipulate that children read at least 3 times a week. Parents/ carers must write in the child's planner or sign next to your child's writing to say that they have read. Children who read

5 times a week will receive a raffle ticket. At the end of each half term, a raffle ticket will be drawn for each class and the winning child will receive a prize.

Homework in KS2

The children in KS2 will take home a 'homework menu' inside their homework book with a range of different activities to complete, based upon our wider learning in school for the half term.



The stipulation is that children complete one piece of homework a week, recorded in any form, in their homework book. If children do not complete one piece of homework, they will be given time at break or lunchtime to complete this.

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

As a school, we aim for 95% attendance from all our pupils.


All children will have days when they're not able to go to school, whether that's due to illness, holiday or a family emergency, and the occasional day off is unlikely to affect their education.

However, missing too much school can be seriously detrimental.

A child who misses school just twice per month will lose out on 18 days' education across the school year – that's nearly four weeks!.

Poor attendance often starts at primary school, and children who fall into this pattern are likely to underachieve at secondary school. Friendships can be affected by persistent absence, too: it can be hard for a child who misses lots of school to form relationships with their classmates.

Poor attendance also reflects badly on your child's school. Ofsted expect all schools to have good attendance rates, and they are marked down in inspections if their absence figures are too high.



We kindly ask that, wherever possible, all appointments are made out of school time - though we know this cannot always be the case. We are sure you will agree that we all want our children to succeed, and good attendance is proven to give children the maximum learning time possible.

Taking all this into consideration, any requests for holidays during term-time will not be authorised, unless there are exceptional circumstances (these are set out by the government).
