

Headlice

Headlice are in school again. PARENTS
ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR CHECKING
THEIR CHILDREN'S HAIR FOR
HEADLICE AND EGGS.

Please be responsible and check your child's hair daily, especially on the hair behind the ears, nape of the neck and close to the scalp. It is extremely frustrating for families who are checking and treating their child's hair to keep getting reinfected and also for school staff who are at risk of infection. If children have hair that is longer than shoulder length can you please make sure that it is tied back when they are at school? This not only helps to stop the spread of nits but is also safer during P.E lessons and more hygienic during lunchtime.

Can we please ask that if it has been frosty and the car needs to be cleared or if the footpaths are going to take a bit longer to walk on that you allow the extra time to get to school.
