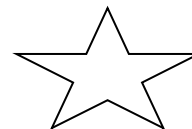

Headlice are in school again. **PARENTS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR CHECKING THEIR CHILDREN'S HAIR FOR HEAD LICE AND EGGS.**

Please be responsible and check your child's hair daily, especially on the hair behind the ears, nape of the neck and close to the scalp. It is extremely frustrating for families who are checking and treating their child's hair to keep getting re-infected and also for school staff who are at risk of infection.

Treatments are available over the counter at chemists. If children have hair that is longer than shoulder length can you please make sure that it is tied back when they are at school. This not only helps to stop the spread of nits but is also safer during P.E lessons and more hygienic during lunchtime.
