Use of correct tense consistently improved in written work.
For 100% of pupils <u>FSM 6</u> Mathletics subscription for all KS2 pupils	Access to maths games & challenges via internet maths program. Provision was made for those unable to access a computer from home.	5%	90% of KS2 pupils made expected or more progress in maths.
For 11% of pupils <u>FSM6</u> Supplementary resources to help pupils become secondary ready.
