Anti-Bullying Week

This week we have been learning about bullying and what to do if we see any bullying behaviour. We were fortunate to receive a visit from Rev Steve who gave a wonderful talk to the children about how we should not make people feel sad and upset.

What have the Infants done this week?

This week we have been reading the Town and Country mouse book and using this to write letters to each of the mice, apply the skills we learnt in last week's English lessons.

In Maths we have been working with money, recognising, counting, ordering by value and size, adding two items together and Year 2 have also been finding out how much change they have left from a given amount.

In our topic work we thought about what we could see from our own doorsteps at home and talking about them to see if they are the same or different.

Today we talked about Children in need and the children have been busy doing activities linked to counting how much money they can fit on the different sized Pudsey Bears and making their own book marks. We had a lovely walk round Stillington today learning about the history of the village from Miss Cole.

What have the Junior's done this week?

Well done for some fantastic science investigations this week!

The children have been exploring the different components of electrical circuits and the impact of adding more cells or components like motors, lamps and buzzers. This knowledge will help the children to add lights and motors to their moon buggies - and switches so that we can turn them off! Some children might include safety switches too!

In literacy next week we will start to learn about biographies and autobiographies. We will consider what might be included in these and how the events are ordered through the text. We will develop our own autobiographies and then write a biography about Neil Armstrong.

In maths, Year 5/6 will continue to learn about statistics whilst Y3/4 will review their knowledge of all 4 number operations.

We will also continue to develop our 3d landscapes in art, thinking carefully about different textures and how we can create 3d effects.
