Last week we opened the doors for our first morning parents reading session, WOW what a great turn out! It was great to see some many of you who were able to stay reading, sharing and enjoying books. For those of you who were not able to stay don't worry the children either read to each other or had one of the other adults in school to read with. We sent home new reading record books with your child's reading level linked to the book banded colour system so they can easily choose books, within each band there will be some more challenge text and these books will have a gold sticker on. Remember we are encouraging children to read more and for every 5 reads they will get a stamp towards their bronze, silver or gold awards. Next week EYFS/KS1 are off to Easingwold fire station so look out for the letter in book bags tonight and please return to school on Monday.

This week in EYFS/KS1 we have been writing similes about fire, we had our own fire in the garden so that the children could experience a fire first hand to be able to write about it and compare it to a range of objects. In maths we have been working on place value to 50 and year 2 have been learning about statistics, tally charts and pictograms, using the information they collected in their own traffic survey to see how many different types of vehicles pass our school.

Key Stage 2

Have been developing character descriptions of Urg - a Palaeolithic girl exploring beyond her cave. Next week, due to the creation of Stillington Time-Travel Tours, we will be writing texts to persuade the public to travel back in time to the Stone Age! In maths Year 3 and 4 have been investigating perimeters whilst Year 5/6 have been finding Areas of different shapes. Next week we will all enter the fabulous world of Fractions! Next week we will also be exploring fossils.
