




# Message from the Headteacher

# **Cost of school meals**

Governors have chosen not to increase the price of a school meal for as long as possible in order to support our families, but unfortunately due to rising costs and budget constraints they have made the difficult decision to gradually increase the price.

The first rise will to £2.75 per meal from 18th April, and then we anticipate that they will need to rise again to the region of £3.00 in September, in line with the increased

catering charges.

We understand that this may cause some inconvenience and frustration for families, and we want to assure you that, as a group of small schools, we have worked hard to keep the costs down and will continue to do so.

If you get certain benefits, your child could qualify for free school meals during all school years. Even if they already receive the Universal Infant Free School Meals (for Reception, Year 1 & Year 2 pupils) it may be worth applying, as they could then continue to receive free meals from Year 3. To qualify you must be receiving one of the following:

- Universal Credit, provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods (£616.67 per month)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under part six of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit, provided you are also not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual household gross income that does not exceed £16,190 (as assessed by HMRC)
- Working Tax Credit run-on, paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

Please note that contributions-based benefits, including contribution-related Jobseekers' Allowance do not entitle you to claim free school meals. To check please go to: <a href="https://www.northyorks.gov.uk/free-school-meals">https://www.northyorks.gov.uk/free-school-meals</a>.


Your child will need to bring a **packed lunch.** It is now too late to order one from school.
